



# Canada–Singapore AI + Quantum Roundtable

## About the Roundtable

As secretariat for the APEC Business Advisory Council (ABAC) Canada, the Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada is partnering with SGTech to lead a delegation of senior industry leaders, researchers, and officials to Singapore May 18-22, 2026, to advance bilateral collaboration in AI and quantum technologies. Anchored around Asia Tech x Singapore, the Mission will convene senior leaders from both countries’ AI and quantum innovation ecosystems.

Developed in collaboration with ABAC Canada, senior industry leaders, the High Commission of Canada in Singapore, and Export Development

Canada, the Mission represents an early engagement under the AI+Q initiative and a focused platform to advance Canada’s priorities with trusted partners.

Programming for the five-day Mission includes an invitation-only Canada–Singapore AI+Quantum Roundtable at APF Canada’s Asia Regional Office (ARO) in Singapore (May 19), an AI & Quantum Networking Reception (ARO; May 19), and targeted bilateral meetings, connecting Canadian companies with key Singaporean government stakeholders and leading enterprises across cybersecurity, defence, maritime logistics, and health and life sciences.
