Navigating the Emerging Geopolitical Dynamics in the Canadian Arctic and the North Pacific

Arctic security is at an inflection point. Intensifying great-power competition, rapid technological change, and accelerating environmental shifts are converging in ways that elevate risks to Canada's sovereignty, infrastructure, and alliances. While Canada's strategic lens has often focused on the European Arctic, the North Pacific dimension—particularly with Japan and South Korea—remains under-explored and increasingly consequential.

A sharp, near-term challenge is the vulnerability of subsea infrastructure, including the data cables that

underpin military communications, financial flows, and internet connectivity across the North. With projects such as Far North Fibre poised to link Asia, North America, and Europe, resilience against state and "gray-zone" threats is urgent. At the same time, Russia's Arctic militarization and China's dual-use footprint (infrastructure, research, and technology) signal deeper strategic convergence; joint patrols, cyber capabilities, and electronic warfare amplify risks from the seabed to space. Melting ice expands naval access and exposure of critical undersea assets.
