Larissa Lai is the author of two novels, When Fox Is a Thousand and Salt Fish Girl; two books of poetry, sybil unrest (with Rita Wong) and Automaton Biographies; and most recently, a critical book, Slanting I, Imagining We: Asian Canadian Literary Production in the 1980s and 1990s. A recipient of the Astraea Foundation Emerging Writers' Award, she has been a finalist for the Books in Canada First Novel Award, the Tiptree Award, the Sunburst Award, the City of Calgary W.O. Mitchell Award, the bpNichol Chapbook Award, the Dorothy Livesay Prize and the ACQL Gabrielle Roy Prize for Literary Criticism. Lai currently holds a Canada Research Chair II in Creative Writing at the University of Calgary and directs The Insurgent Architects' House for Creative Writing there; and is working on a third novel entitled Doubler, Starfish, Groom.

Andrew Lee is a Vancouver based artist. His installations, sound compositions, music and photography have been exhibited in Vancouver, Malmo and New York. In 2010 he was a part of the exhibition First Nations/Second Nature at the Audain Gallery and in 2011 was asked by artist group Young-Hae Chang Heavy Industries to compose a sound piece that would exhibit formally the characteristics of seeing. His work has been presented at the Vancouver Art Gallery, as well as works at The Centre for Performance Research in New York (2012), Kunstradio in Vienna (2013), The Vancouver Planetarium (2015), The International Symposium On Electronic Art (2015) and most recently at The Surrey Art Gallery.



Rita Wong has written four books of poetry: undercurrent (Nightwood 2015), sybil unrest (co-written with Larissa Lai, Line Books, 2008), forage (Nightwood 2007), and monkeypuzzle (Press Gang 1998), as well as one graphic collection called perpetual (with Cindy Mochizuki, Nightwood 2015). forage won Canada Reads Poetry in 2011. Wong received the Asian Canadian Writers Workshop Emerging Writer Award in 1997, and the Dorothy Livesay Poetry Prize in 2008. With Dorothy Christian, she has co-edited an anthology called Downstream: Reimagining Water, forthcoming with Wilfrid Laurier University Press. Living on unceded Coast Salish territories she investigates the relationships between poetry, social justice, ecology, and decolonization through learning from and with water.
